### FROM THE RECTOR:

The season of Advent is upon us. Preparation time for the celebration of the birth of Christ. Each year I encourage you to spend some time to reflect on the nature of this great feast of the church and most important event in our own Christian lives. Our Advent season is a bit truncated this year due to the fact that the fourth Sunday of Advent is also Christmas Eve. That leaves us only three full weeks of Advent and preparation time.

What should you do to prepare? I suggest reading the Bible more during this time, especially Isaiah 9 and 11 and from 40 to the end. These readings are rich in messianic prophecy. They stir the spirit and help us reflect on the true meaning of the Incarnation. Spend a little extra time in quiet with the Lord. Ask Him to help you make this feast a reality in your own life so that you can live as a child of God even as Jesus is the Son of God.

Because the fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Christmas Eve, we will not have our traditional decorating party. For any of you who wish to help decorate the church for Christmas this year, please plan on staying after coffee on the 24. That's when we will decorate.

### SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS

Thank you to all you supported our Operation Christmas Child project for 2006! The children in the Sunday school classes, along with a few adults, were able to fill 33 boxes with the items donated by St. Francis parishioners. Our goal was 20 boxes and we were close to not having enough shoe boxes! The check donations were more than enough to cover the \$7 per box that was requested for processing and delivery. The volunteers at the collection station very much appreciated the cash donations as many people give the boxes, but not the monetary donation.

Over the course of the next year, we would welcome the donation of shoe boxes. It works best if the lid is separate from the box and if the box is the standard size. We can store these in the attic until next year.

During Advent, the Sunday school classes will make a class Advent wreath and have a short service each Sunday to light the candles in addition to the normal class activities. The younger two classes will be preparing for the Christmas Pageant. Thanks to Julie Rambin and Claire Ducker who continue to teach the younger two classes and to Jim Crandell for leading the older students.

Christmas Pageant 2006: On the morning of the 24<sup>th</sup>, the younger two Sunday school classes will present a Christmas Pageant in the Parish House at 10:00 am. If you enjoy watching children aged 12 and under dress up in period costumes and act out the Christmas story, please come and be a part of the audience.

### MAIN STREET BETHLEHEM

On Sunday, Dec. 3<sup>rd</sup>, a group of adults and children from St. Francis will converge at Main Street Bethlehem in Burnet. Each year, the First Baptist Church presents a live portrayal of Bethlehem the night that Jesus was born. The area is packed with townspeople, soldiers, crafters, sellers, blacksmiths, etc. all in costumes. Each will interact with you as though they were in Bethlehem.

The opening time is 6 pm in Burnet. If you are interested in carpooling or caravanning to Burnet, plan to meet at the church at 4 pm. 


