### **FROM THE RECTOR:**

#### Lent Begins

Wednesday, March 9, is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Even though we have been in a Pre-Lenten season, Lent begins in earnest. On Ash Wednesday, there will be two services at St. Francis. Holy Communion will be celebrated at 12:00 noon with the distribution of ashes after the homily. We will pray the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm followed by the distribution of ashes. Also, after the Stations each Wednesday evening during Lent I will reflect on one of the seven penitential psalms. Our Transformation Prayer group will continue to meet after these liturgical activities and anyone who attends the Stations is certainly welcome to stay and pray with us for about an hour.

Lent is, of course, a time of preparation for the celebration of the Lord's resurrection. That preparation is a serious reflection on our part for the need of the Lord's passion, death and resurrection for us personally. It is a time to take serious stock in our personal relationship with God, our understanding of the need for forgiveness and redemption and the ongoing need to observe the commandment "Be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy (Lev. 19:2)". While there is still time, make the commitment to observe this Lent with a seriousness that you may not have had for a while. Sometime later in the Lenten season, there will be a penitential service with absolution. I will have to figure out a good day. More information on that later.

Daylight Saving Time begins on Sunday, March 13. Set your clocks forward one hour before you go to bed on the 12th. You can't miss church on the first Sunday of Lent.

#### Lenten Reading

From time to time (very infrequently as a matter of fact) I recommend a book or two that I found to be interesting and helpful. I would like to offer you two titles that you might find helpful. The first is Praying The Names of God by Ann Spangler. This is one of those daily guides to prayer based on some of the many names we find for God in the Hebrew Scriptures. She has a companion book entitled Praying The Names of Jesus that I have not yet read so I cannot specifically recommend that one. In each chapter, Spangler gives you some background on the name, some thoughtful questions, some suggestions for prayer and multiple Scripture references. I have found it informative and helpful for my morning prayer. The second title is Heaven by Randy Alcorn. This might be subtitled "Everything You Wanted To Know About Heaven But Were Afraid To Ask." I guarantee you that there are few people on the planet who have thought this much about heaven and actually put it into print. It is quite repetitious in spots but don't be deterred. It is also quite uplifting, a quite enjoyable book to read. Much of his thoughts are based on the bible with a little speculation thrown in for good measure. But it will certainly give you something to think about. Let me offer you my usual disclaimer here. Just because I recommend a book does not mean that I necessarily agree with everything in the book, only that I believe you will find it interesting and helpful. I hope that you enjoy them.

## **Youth Christian Education News**

The elementary class begins the month of March classes with two New Testament stories involving Jesus' life and ends with lessons centering on the events of Holy Week. As the last week of Jesus' life is packed with stories vital to Christians, these lessons are spread out over the last four weeks of Lent.

The first two lessons in March are from John: Mary anointing the feet of Jesus to the chagrin of some of the disciples (John 12:1-8), Jesus Healing at the pool of Beth-z'atha (John 5:1-8) and then onto events of the last week of Jesus' life: Jesus washing the feet of his disciples (John 13:1-20), and the last supper (Mark 14:12-16, 22-26).

As is customary, the children will make a mite box for Lent and discuss Lenten rules that they can follow.

The youth class will have completed their unit on the fathers of the church by the end of February with Mike Ready. Watch for the announcement of the next unit in the pew sheet.

The children who attend the afternoon service for Baraka decided they liked having Sunday school with the other children at 9:30. This involves re-arranging the transporting of the children from their home near Metric and 183 to St. Francis at 9:30 and back again. If all the children who could attend Sunday school came at once, the class will have 10 students -- quite a crowd for our little space. I may need to investigate other uses of the space in the parish house.

The confirmation class for youth continues to meet periodically during the 11:00 service with three of our youth preparing for eventual confirmation.

As always, I appeal for you to include the St. Francis Sunday school program in your prayers.
