Confirmation

On Sunday, October 23, The Right Reverend William W. Millsaps, Presiding Bishop Emeritus of the Episcopal Missionary Church, will be here to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation. I wrote about confirmation last month before I knew the exact date so I will not repeat any of that information. However, it is a major event to have a visit from the bishop and I hope that everyone will try to be here for his visit. As always, there will be a reception after the service for the confirmands provided by St. Clare's Guild and an opportunity to talk with the bishop if you have never done so before.

A Response

The recent wildfires in the central Texas area were devastating to a great number of people in and around Austin. Many organization and ministries throughout the area were on the scene trying to help people, many of whom lost everything. The Salvation Army is always in the midst of responses to disasters like these and the Vestry has voted to send a donation to them to assist them in these efforts. A number of our parishioners were very close to these fires. None of them suffered any real loss. For that, we are grateful to God. Please continue to pray for these people and if God puts it on your heart to make some kind of personal response, please do so.

October has five Sundays and on the fifth Sunday of the month we always have a Pot Luck lunch following the 11:00 am Holy Communion service. Some of our recent Pot Lucks have been less well attended than in the past. This is a great opportunity to spend some time over a meal with some other parishioners who perhaps you may not

talk with very often. I realize that there may be other commitments from time to time, but please consider joining us for some food and conversation on October 30.

40 Days for Life

Even though the fall campaign for 40 Days for Life has begun, I'm sure that your presence at one of the abortion clinics in the area would still be appreciated, if you have not already made the commitment for this fall. If you are not familiar with 40 Days for Life, it is a prayer vigil, twelve hours per day, seven days per week, this fall beginning on September 28 and ending November 6. Each person is asked to spend one hour in prayer at one of three abortion clinics in Austin. Sidewalk counselors are available all day long to speak with women who are contemplating having an abortion. Since 40 Days began in Austin, hundreds of lives have been saved and the number is in the thousands nationwide. Many of the women who have decided to keep their babies have said that it was simply our prayerful presence in front of these clinics that helped change their minds. In speaking with the sidewalk counselors, these women discover that they have other choices and simply need the encouragement to choose life rather than ending their pregnancy. Organizations like the Austin Pregnancy Resource Center are there to help. St. Francis proudly sponsors both 40 Days for Life and APRC. In addition to your financial and prayer support, volunteer opportunities are available at both of these organizations. As I have mentioned to you before, the Episcopal Missionary Church is officially Pro-Life. Please take the opportunity to think about your personal response to this extremely important question in our country and city

Sunday School for Youth

I had the opportunity to transport Adonette and Christian to Sunday on September 11. The level of excitement expressed by these two was comparable to a young child waiting on Christmas Day. Neither slept very well the night before and both woke up at the crack of dawn to be ready to go at 8:45 when I knocked at their door. Neither could stop talking in the car both to church and on the way home. Such excitement about Sunday school is contagious and a blessing to the other youth and the adults involved in Sunday school.

Classes began with the expectation that the younger class would have 11 and the youth class 3 students. By the end of the month, most have shown up at least once. Thanks to the parent(s) of the 7 families involved who made sure their charges came to Sunday school.

The youth class is being ably led by Doug Cooper. Using a curriculum titled Teach Deep, the students have finished a set of lessons on studying the life of Jesus and will move into a unit on three of the parables and then begin a 7 week session on what Jesus said about himself. The lessons provide food for thought for everyone involved.

The younger class starts out in the church service, exiting to the parish house at the announcements. For about 15 minutes, the class is combined for the opening activities and the Bible story. The group then divides by readers and non-readers for activities that relate to the story. I am pleased that five adults willingly said "YES!" when asked to be in a rotation to led the older group. Thanks to Martelle Wathen, Missy Bernard, Rebecca Hoard, Cassandra Jenson, and Kim Norris for helping out. I am leading the younger group. Following the layout and activities from One Room Sunday School curriculum and with input on the overall theme from Fr. Len, the lessons in October will be on the Genesis stories of Jacob and Esau from chapters 25, 27 and 28. Each class ends with prayers and a snack, followed most Sundays by a trip to the playground.

Sunday school and church activities only make up a small portion of the life of these children and youth -- for many it is only this one hour on most

Sundays. It is my hope and expectation that prayers, Bible reading and discussions of God are major activity in every home. The parent is still the primary instructor on the child's religious instruction with Sunday school serving as an important supplement to the home instruction. Our parents need your prayers.

Please pray for the children and youth of St. Francis. They are the future of our church. There are so many competing forces for a young person's attention both now and when they leave home. Pray that they develop a rock solid faith that will not waiver as they reach adulthood.

Bring to the east room of the parish house and add to the growing stack outside the nursery door.
