FROM THE RECTOR:

First of all, a blessed and happy new year to all of you! I can't believe that it's 2012. As always, our Christmas celebrations were beautiful thanks to all those who participated in the decorating, the preparation and execution of the liturgical celebrations and all the behind the scenes work of the choir, musicians and Altar Guild. I am grateful for the participation of all in these services.

Along the very same lines of appreciation, we will once again have a parish appreciation dinner either in January or early February. Since I have not yet arranged anything, the details will have to be forthcoming. But be assured that I have not forgotten about it. I just haven't gotten around to it.

For some time I have been considering doing another Inquirer's Class based on the basics of the Christian faith and our Anglican expression of it. I had thought about beginning in January after things settled down a bit. But the weather is sometimes uncooperative at this time of year and so I propose to do it in the spring, beginning after Easter. It is usually six weeks long and the sessions are about 60 to 90 minutes each. This is usually a good preparation for adult confirmation but I have been told by some of you who have come back for a refresher course that you have enjoyed it and gotten a great deal out of it. So look for this class to begin around mid-April.

Sunday, January 22, is Respect Life Sunday throughout the nation. It is also the 39th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision making abortion a constitutional right in this country. We will do something to commemorate the day. As I have mentioned to you often in the past, it is my belief that the killing of our children is one of the reasons, if not the most important one, that our God has turned away His hand of protection from this nation. This is a great offense against the majesty and sovereignty of God and until we come to our senses in this country and once again honor Him as creator, we will continue to decline as a nation.

Thanks to all of you who have made a pledge to St. Francis for 2012. It is, of course, what allows us to keep going. I appreciate each and every one of your pledges no matter the size. I hope that your pledge reflects a conversation with God about your commitment to Him as well as to the church. If you have not yet made your pledge, there is still time. We never turn down pledge cards. The Vestry will finalize the budget we intend to present to the parish at the annual meeting in February during our January Vestry meeting. Please get your pledge card in before that so that our Treasurer, Mike Ready, can work up a proposed budget for 2012. Thanks.

We are approaching (actually we're probably already there) the cold and flu season. Just a bit of etiquette for the Holy Communion. If you have a communicable disease, it might be well to stay home until you are no longer contagious. If, however, you decide to come to church, it would be wise to avoid the common communion chalice. I realize that communion under both species is the norm in this church, but please use some common sense as well. I ask you to respect the health of your brothers and sisters in the congregation by doing what you can not to spread the germs. Finally, I have already been advised of the date for this year's Austin Marathon. It is Sunday, February 19. The route for the race will once again affect 15th Street/Enfield. You will not be able to get to church using that road. I'm telling you in advance and I will let you know again in the next newsletter.

In case you get this before January 1, I remind you that there will only be one service on New Year's Day. That will be at 11:00 o'clock. There will be no 9:30 service that day. Our regular schedule will resume on January 8.
