FROM THE RECTOR:

Holy Week

You should be receiving this as we are about to begin Holy Week. It is called that for obvious reasons and our thoughts should turn toward those reasons as we enter into the sacred mysteries that we celebrate. These eight days in the life of Jesus must have seemed like an eternity to Him. There was little question in His mind what was to take place even as He entered Jerusalem amid shouts of “Hosanna to the Son of David.” St. John tells us very early in his gospel that Jesus would not entrust himself to men, for He knows how fickle human beings can be.

The days between Palm Sunday and the celebration of the Passover with His disciples on Thursday evening must have been ones of deep thought and probably constant prayer, leading up to His giving them the eternal memorial of His passion and death shortly before entering into His bloody agony in the garden on the night before He died. We cannot even imagine the thoughts of a holy, divine, human savior surveying the depths of separation from His Father for the only time in His life and pleading that He not have to undergo this trial before ultimately surrendering to the divine will. I remember a phrase from the Stations of the Cross during my early seminary days. O superabundance of love! It was for our sake that He surrendered Himself. Jesus was not dragged kicking and screaming to the cross. He willingly gave up His life out of love for the world to make atonement for our sins. O superabundance of love, indeed.

Jesus was never preoccupied with Himself, even on the cross. As our current version of the Stations of the Cross relates, “For three hours has Jesus hung

upon his pierced hands; his blood has run down in streams; and in the midst of excruciating sufferings, he has pardoned his murderers, promised the bliss of Paradise to the good thief, and committed his blessed Mother and Beloved Disciple to each other’s care.” Only then did He surrender His life.

While these events seem so familiar to us, we should question whether or not they really are. It is, of course, one thing to participate in these liturgical celebrations and I certainly encourage that. Let me encourage you to walk through Holy Week with our Savior this year. Read these scriptures again and again. Let the Lord speak to you about His Holy Week, not just your commemoration of it. Ask Him to take you along with Him as He rides into Jerusalem. Sit with Him at the Last Supper and experience the first Eucharist along with Judas’ betrayal. Walk the Way of the Cross and stand with the holy woman and beloved disciple at the foot of the cross. And then hurry to the tomb on Easter morning to be confronted with the angel’s “He is risen.” Let Him open up these passages to you, perhaps like never before. Whatever your Lent has been to this point, make your Holy Week one that you may have not experienced in a long time or perhaps ever before. Then, come and celebrate with us these sacred mysteries. Our Sunday worship on both Palm Sunday and Easter will be at 9:30 and 11:00 am. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday will be at 7:00 pm and the Solemn Easter Vigil on the night before Easter Sunday will be at 7:30 pm.

Elementary Class

To help the students in the Sunday school class to observe Lent, each worked on a poster that emphasized Prayer, Alms, and Fasting to put up at home. Each child created a box for coins to collect during Lent which will be combined together after Easter and a donation made to one of several charities the children know about. The poster had a sheet that showed the road to Easter with separate blocks for each day. I asked them to say a prayer and mark that day off, so they can see the progress towards Easter. The fasting is more challenging – but most came up with something to give up and seem to be diligent in keeping their fast.

The lessons during April are:

- April 1: Jesus’ triumphal entry into Jerusalem (followed by a quick review of the events of the rest of Holy Week)
- April 8: Resurrection Story
- April 15: The Road to Emmaus
- April 22: Breakfast with the Savior
- April 29: The Great Commission
