FROM THE RECTOR:

Confirmation Classes

I am aware that there may be a number of parishioners who either need to be or would like to be confirmed. Therefore, I will hold Confirmation classes beginning in November and running through early December. I would appreciate it if you would contact me directly if you would like to participate so that we can have the classes at a time that is convenient for us all. Confirmation will likely take place in the spring. Everyone who is not confirmed in the church should be. The sacraments are given to us for our benefit and should be received when they are available. Since this sacrament requires a bishop (at least in this church), special arrangements need to be made. Please take advantage of this opportunity, not only to learn more about your faith, but to receive the strengthening of the Holy Spirit for your life.

While I'm on the subject of sacraments, aside from the so called Dominical sacraments of Baptism and Holy Eucharist, the church has other sacraments that are profitable for our spiritual lives. Two of them are readily available to you through the ministry of priests. The first is confession. When I first came to the Anglican Church I was told by an Anglican bishop

that there was an axiom that governed the use of this sacrament in the church. It goes like this: all may, some should, none must. It seems that most people in the Anglican Church follow the last part of this axiom. A few years ago I put out a teaching on individual confession which was, how shall I say it, received tepidly. Even though "none must", I maintain that there is a profit to be had from publicly admitting your sins to a priest and seeking spiritual council and guidance. The object of the spiritual life is holiness, not maintenance. Most people need assistance to progress in the spiritual life. All I'm saying is that even if it is not necessary, might it not be helpful?

The other sacrament readily available to all of you is the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick or Uncction. There is a biblical exhortation in the Letter of James that one should send for the priests of the church if one is sick so that the priest may lay hands on the sick person and anoint them with oil. Many people seem to think that this applies to only people who are seriously ill or in danger of death. But if you are on medication for some chronic condition, if you are infirm in any way, if there are impediments of any kind in your

physical, emotional or spiritual well-being, this sacrament is there for you. We pray for healing every Sunday after the 11:00 am Holy Communion service. It takes only a few minutes and it may be of great help to you. A number of people over the years have told me that they have been healed or at least helped by these prayers. I encourage you to take this to heart and if you have a need, address it.

Finally, I would ask you to continue praying for our country and for the elections in November. There will be early voting beginning this month and I would ask that you take your decision about the nominees to the Lord. This is one of our greatest freedoms and therefore, it is one of our greatest responsibilities. You should know who you are voting for, at least to the best of your ability. You should know what they stand for and what they intend for the country, state or whatever office they seek. For the Christian, there should never be a separation of church and state at the ballot box. If you are a Christian, you should vote as a Christian. Morally, you can do nothing else.
