There are folders with the documents on a table in the hallway to the restrooms.



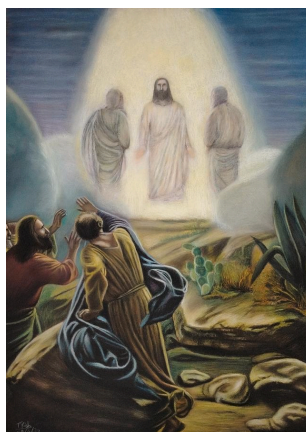
